DEFIBRILLATOR TRAINING SESSION

The Community Council has recently installed a defibrillator on the front wall of the Llandough War Memorial Hall which will be available for use on a 24/7 basis. This facility has the potential to save lives.

Defibrillators are devices that apply an electric charge or current to the heart to restore a normal heartbeat. If the heart rhythm stops due to cardiac arrest, also known as sudden cardiac arrest (SCA), a defibrillator may help it start beating again.

It is important that members of the community especially those living close to the hall and regular hirers are provided with training in the use of this life-saving facility.

A training session has been arranged for Thursday 1st February 2024 in the Llandough War Memorial Hall from 4.00pm to 5.30pm. The session can accommodate 60 participants.
