The Llandough War Memorial Hall comprises of a large hall capable of accommodating up to 100 people, a large and well-equipped kitchen, disabled toilet facilities and rear meeting room space for up to 12 people.

The Hall has been maintained to a very high standard and is currently available for celebratory parties, meetings of groups as well as sporting and cultural activities. Hire rates are very reasonable for occasional users the rate is £15 for the first hour and £11 per hour thereafter and for regular users a much reduced price of £9.00 per hour. There are a number of weekday evening and weekend slots that are available for immediate hire.

MATTERS OF GENERAL INTEREST TO RESIDENTS

CORBETT ROAD ALLOTMENTS

Members of the community are invited to contact the Clerk to the Council if they are interested in putting their name down for an allotment at the Corbett Road site. The Community Council manages the site and it is in very good condition offering the opportunity to grow wholesome vegetables and meet new friends. A Tenant's Association is in place to assist the Council in the management of the site and represent the interests of tenants to Councillors. The cost of renting a plot for a full year is in the region of £30 and this offers extremely good value for what can be gained from allotment gardening. There is a reduction in cost available to senior citizens.

COMMUNITY TRANSPORT SCHEME

The Council operates a community transport scheme for the benefit of local residents who wish to visit to local supermarkets. The service operated by Paul Morris, a local resident, is available on Thursday mornings and anyone interested in accessing the service should contact the Clerk to the Council.

The role is varied and enables local people to use their skills and experience to enhance the work undertaken by the Council for the benefit of the community.

CIVIC SERVICE

BROOK GREEN POCKET PARK

For those of you who walk through the pocket park situated at the top of Llandough Hill you will have noticed that the water that used to flow through the Brook has disappeared. The Community Council is active in endeavouring to ascertain why after so many years the water has dried up and will continue to explore options to get to the bottom of the matter.

PATHS FOR PEOPLE

The Community Council has contacted the Ramblers Association for guidance on how actions can be taken to encourage the use of the footpaths within the community. It is important that the paths are regularly walked so that maintenance issues can be identified and put right ensuring that there is uninterrupted use.

COUNCIL PRECEPT

The Community Council raises a local tax each year that residents pay as part of their council tax to the Vale of Glamorgan Council. The monies collected are then paid to the Community Council for it to fund the amenities provided to residents as well as the day to day work of the Council. It has been decided that for 2016/17 the amount charged will remain the same. The precept as it is called is used to:

- a) Maintain the village green, village garden and the Brook Green pocket park.
- b) Maintain the Corbett Road allotments site.
- c) Fund Christmas trees.
- d) Pay for the village fete.
- e) Contribute to the costs of running the Llandough War Memorial Hall.
- f) Part funding the community transport scheme.

PARKING ON ESTATE ROADS

In order to reduce the congestion on Estate roads residents with driveways are urged to use them in order to reduce the number of cars parked on Dochdwy Road. Residents who have no option but to park on Estate roads are respectfully requested to park sensibly and not cause any unnecessary obstructions.
