<u>Minute 5</u> – The Committee was informed that a grant application had been submitted to Sports Wales for £20k which if approved would obviate the need for the Council to obtain a loan towards the cost of the MUGA.

4. BECOMING A DEMENTIA FRIENDLY COMMUNITY.

Councillors Carreyett and W. Williams had recently attended a seminar organised by the Alzheimer's Society and links to the organisation's website were provided to members in advance of the meeting. In the discussion that

took place a number of suggestions were made as to how the Council could take steps to create a dementia friendly community as follows: -

- a) Encouragement could be given to people using Cogan Pill Road as a form of nature walk. The recent installation of a park bench could make this walk more attractive.
- b) The community transport service should be more widely published and volunteers sought to help people using the service with their shopping needs.
- c) Leaflets provided details of services from the Alzheimer's Disease Society to be located on noticeboards and on the Council's website.
- d) The Council could provide active support for the local Forget me Not Choir and invite them to take part in the annual Carol Service and Coffee Morning.
- e) The proceeds of the raffle at the Carol Service could be donated to the Choir.
- f) A link between the Choir and the School to be explored by Councillor Dr Misra in his engagement with the Headteacher.
- g) A talk from the Alzheimer's Disease Society could be organised in the Hall.
- h) The Thursday Club could be approached to see if they had information about those in the community who suffered with dementia.

RESOLVED that: The Clerk in consultation with the Chairman to explore these suggestions and develop an action plan for consideration by the Council.
