

The Baptist Church and Rose Cottage

The Baptist congregation of Llandough originally met in Rose Cottage, opposite Lewis Road. This house is no longer standing, but the original garden walls can still be seen in front of the flats built on the site.

The current Llandough Baptist Chapel was built in 1859 as successor to the Rose Cottage meeting house. The main building and porch were of stone, sourced from Llandough quarry, with a slate roof but no interior ceiling: the style is the Simple Gothic style. After the appointment of John Garland as part-time minister in 1979, a number of extensions and modernizations were made.
