# MAKING USE OF YOUR COMMUNITY HALL

The Llandough War Memorial Hall comprises of a large hall capable of accommodating up to 100 people, a large and well-equipped kitchen, disabled toilet facilities, baby changing facilities and rear meeting room space for up to 12 people.

The Hall has been maintained to a very high standard and is currently available for celebratory parties, meetings of groups as well as sporting and cultural activities. Hire rates are very reasonable - for occasional users the rate is £15 for the first hour and £11 per hour thereafter and for regular users a much-reduced price of £9.00 per hour. There are a limited number of weekday evening and weekend slots that are available for immediate hire.

# MULTI USER GAMES AREA (MUGA)

Good news is often short of abundance in times of austerity but your community council is delighted to be able to inform you that the top priority identified in last year's community engagement survey of having a MUGA in Llandough is now a reality. With the support of the Vale of Glamorgan Council's Strong Communities grant scheme and what are known as S106 funds (housing developer contributions for local infrastructure improvements) the Council has decided to proceed with the project by making up the remaining cost difference from its own funds. This facility will provide recreational opportunities for our young people and it is sure to be well used. Work will commence after April next year.

A MUGA is a sports court that can be used for a variety of different sports such as football and basketball. It will be located on a suitable site within the King George V Memorial Playing Fields.

#### WHAT HAS YOUR COMMUNITY COUNCIL ACHIEVED IN 2018

- Maintained the village green (outside the Church), the village garden (off Spencer Drive) and Brook Green (off Llandough Hill)
- Improved the surface of the Brook Green footbridge and repaired the underground water leak enabling safe use of the footway
- Continued to provide a weekly community transport service to local supermarkets
- Managed the Corbett Road allotments site
- Organised the Rogation Walk with the local primary school
- Provided grants to local organisations
- Has been successful in pursuing a grant for a multi-user games facility
- As principal trustee has ensured that the Memorial Hall provides an excellent facility for local groups, birthday parties and other events
- Worked closely with Councillor George Carroll to ensure that matters requiring attention by the Vale of Glamorgan Council are given priority
- Funded the fireworks for the School's Bonfire Night display
- Worked with the school on a range of local projects engaging children in the priorities of its community
- Planted wildflower seeds, bulbs and installed additional bird and bat boxes in furtherance of local bio-diversity (School pupils involved in the bulb planting)
- Cleared fallen leaves from Cogan Pill Road and arranged two litter picks
- Commented on a range of planning applications ensuring the views of the community were made known to the planning authority
