24 May, 21 June, 19 July, 13 September, 25 October and 22 November from 10.00am until 12 Noon with free refreshments being provided. Posters reminding residents of the coffee mornings will be published on social media and on the community noticeboards but for now you might wish to note the dates in your diary. We hope to see many of you at the hall.

VILLAGE FETE – 8 JUNE

Refreshments will be provided after the Service in the Llandough War Memorial Hall. WHAT DOES YOUR COMMUNITY COUNCIL DO AND FUND?

A question that many of you may ask. At the March coffee morning the Clerk to the Council made a presentation on the work of the Council and you may find a summary of what he told the audience to be of interest to you so here goes:

- > Manages the Corbett allotments site
- Maintains the village green outside the Church
- Maintains the Brook Green pocket park off Llandough Hill
- Maintains the village garden on the corner of Spencer Drive
- Maintains a number of grassed areas on the Estate and at the bottom of Penlan Rise
- Appoints Councillors as Trustees to manage the Llandough War Memorial Hall (Makes grant to the Hall)
- Undertakes a range of biodiversity measures in the community
- Purchased a multi-use games area and a number of play equipment facilities in the playing fields (mostly funded by external grants)
- Organises the village fete and Christmas activities including the Christmas trees and lighting
- > Comments on planning applications
- Recently installed a defibrillator outside the Hall
- Community events such as the Big Lunch, lighting of beacon
- Organises litter picks
- Currently planning for the development of land off Lewis Road for an allotments and community facility to meet local demand for food growing

NEW ALLOTMENT SITE – LEWIS ROAD

Following the second of the community consultation events it became apparent that with some amendments being made to the original concept design there is general support for the site being developed for allotments and a community area. A planning application for the development will soon be prepared and when planning permission is granted the Council will be able to source external grants and make headway in creating the vision for the site which appears to be supported by most local residents. THINKING OF HIRING THE HALL?

The Llandough War Memorial Hall comprises of a large hall capable of accommodating up to 100 people, a large and well-equipped kitchen, disabled toilet facilities, baby changing facilities and rear meeting room space for up to 12 people. We now have free WIFI access and the availability of a projector and screen which can be used subject the payment of a returnable deposit.

The Hall has been maintained to a very high standard and is currently available for celebratory parties, meetings of groups as well as sporting and cultural activities. Hire rates are very reasonable -for occasional users the rate is £20 for the first hour and £15 per hour thereafter and for regular users a much-reduced price of £12.00 per hour. There are a number of weekday evening and weekend slots that are available for immediate hire.
