MAKING USE OF YOUR COMMUNITY HALL

The Llandough War Memorial Hall comprises of a large hall capable of accommodating up to 100 people, a large and well-equipped kitchen, disabled toilet facilities, baby changing facilities and rear meeting room space for up to 12 people.

The Hall has been maintained to a very high standard and is currently available for celebratory parties, meetings of groups as well as sporting and cultural activities. Hire rates are very reasonable - for occasional users the rate is £15 for the first hour and £11 per hour thereafter and for regular users a much-reduced price of £9.00 per hour. There are a limited number of weekday evening and weekend slots that are available for immediate hire.

YOUR OPPORTUNITY TO BECOME A COMMUNITY COUNCILLOR

Llandough Community Council currently has a vacancy for a Councillor which will be filled through the process of co-option. Co-opted Councillors have the same rights and responsibilities as those Councillors who obtain office through election. The position of Community Councillor does not attract any remuneration but expenses are payable. Councillors are expected to attend the monthly meetings of the Council and also to serve on a number of Committees which normally meet on a quarterly cycle. The role is varied and enables local people to use their skills and experience to enhance the work undertaken by the Council for the benefit of the community.

The Council wishes to invite interested and eligible people to submit their applications for the role of Councillor by way of a letter outlining the following:

- the contribution you believe you could make to the work of the Council;
- the personal qualities that you would bring to the role;
- your availability for attending meetings.

WORKING WITH LLANDOUGH PRIMARY SCHOOL

The Council works very closely with the Headteacher to ensure that it supports the engagement of pupils in many aspects of community development. This year, the Council will be coordinating arrangements for the Rogation Walk on 10 May, supporting a historical project to be undertaken by pupils, arranging the annual Carol Concert and Coffee Morning in December (involving Ysgol Pen-y-Garth) and providing finance for the annual Fireworks Display. It is vital that young people are involved in the work of the Community Council as a means of enhancing the social and environmental well-being of all of us.

PROTECTING OUR CHILDREN FROM ADVERSE WEATHER

Many children use the bus stop adjacent to the Primary School to gain access to other schools outside the community and with the wet and windy weather which is typical of our climate they get very wet before they arrive at school. This is very uncomfortable for them and does not represent a good start to the school day. The Council would like to request the Vale of Glamorgan Council to provide a bus shelter at this location but we know from previous consultations there has been some objections to this provision. What we often don't know is the level of support for a proposal that some find to be objectionable. On the basis of fairness and equity, the Council would welcome the views of residents on the proposal. ROAD RESURFACING PRIORITIES

The Council has been asked by the Vale of Glamorgan Council to suggest priorities for road resurfacing in Llandough and that these will be considered in developing the ongoing highway resurfacing programme. The Council decided to ask for priority to be given to the resurfacing of Llandough Hill.
